Nursing Electives (3 hrs)

The Associate of Applied Science in Nursing requires 1 elective. Any one of the non-bolded courses may be taken to fulfill the requirement. The Associate of Applied Science in Nursing also requires 2 hours of KINE. Students completing course in bold may receive the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing through North Harris Montgomery Community College District.

All registered nurses seeking admission to the BSN program must submit the following credentials:

1. Students must present validation of an associate degree in nursing from a Texas nursing associate degree program or an NLN out-of-state accredited nursing program.
2. Documentation of a current license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
3. Documentation of recent nursing practice of at least 6 months full-time or 1 year part-time or a refresher course with a clinical component within the last 2 years.

Thirty-five (35) semester hours will be awarded toward the BSN degree for nurses who have submitted the above credentials and who have completed the first 12 credit hours in the RN to BSN program.

Bold courses are a part of the associate of arts degree. Completion of these and some additional coursework will lead to an associate of arts degree. See NHMCCD catalog for more details.
